Obituary - Jim Daly of Waterford, Ireland

I first met Jim Daly in 1981 at the first Halliwick Course held in Ireland. He was there to learn how he could teach his young nephew with spina bifida to swim. Shortly after that he became Chief Instructor of the first Halliwick club in Ireland, the *Vikings* and later the *Dolphins SC* in Clonmel, 30 miles away.

Jim and I met many times over the years, travelling the length and breadth of Ireland, attending Halliwick courses, eventually becoming lecturers and working as a team. Jim was a great teacher. He had the ability to make any subject interesting and was equally a good listener.

Jim was more than fond of music, he could play a little too. He studied the words of the artist and introduced me to the works of Leonard Cohen. He was a supporter of the Waterford Hurling team, following their matches around the country in all weathers.

Above all, Jim was a family man. He died on 27th January. Our deepest sympathy goes to his greatest supporter, his wife Bernice and their 5 children & 2 grand children.
