Report from the IHA Education and Research Committee

A meeting of the IHA Education and Research Committee was held on Friday 7th September 2007 in Aarhus, Denmark. This was before the IHA Gala and General Meeting. Those present were Ann Gresswell (UK), Bodil Fons Knudsen (Denmark) and Inger-Lise Sorbo (Norway).

The meeting approved Emilie Leeks (UK) as an IHA recognised lecturer and Merav Hadar-Frumer (Israel) as an IHA Senior Lecturer. Congratulations to Emilie & Merav.

The paper on the IHA website 'The Halliwick Concept 2000', which many will be familiar with, was written for lecturers and trainee lecturers. The Committee has decided that a paper, which will be more appropriate for those with no previous knowledge of Halliwick, should be written and have started work on this.
