In memory of Paul O'Byrne ~ 1957- 2008



On a sad note I have to inform you that **Paul O'Byrne** died on November 16th at the age of 51, after an 18 months courageous battle with cancer,

'Life is beautiful and Life is for Living' 'Carpe Diem' or 'seize the day'

This was the philosophy by which Paul lived his life. Paul was the Chief Instructor for **Halliwick Penguins SC in Southgate, North London** and had been a member for 31 years. As Chief Instructor he took great delight in training his club volunteer students and Instructors. His own family were also very involved.

In 2000, Paul was the inspiration behind the Halliwick Millennium Symposium weekend, comprising an International Gala, lectures and a celebration meal.

Because of his skills, Paul led the 'Training the Halliwick lecturers' courses and was instrumental in reaching a large number of Halliwick Instructors. His encouragement and support, mixed with his sense of humour, was an inspiration to many.

Paul was a member of our National Education and Publications Committees and was a great help in the organising of photographs for the 3rd edition of our invaluable handbook "Swimming for People with Disabilities".
