The **2005 National Championships** hosted by ASTRA 15 - Wales at Barry Leisure Centre, South Wales on Saturday, 15th October, 2005, were a great success. The competition was very keen, everyone was made very welcome. Congratulations to the host region for such a memorable event and to all who took part, whether as swimmers or officials. The overall winners of the 'Barnardo Trophy' were **ASTRA 15 - Wales** and **Salefin SC of Halliwick ASTRA 8** won the **National League**. The full results appear on page **4** of this Newsletter.

Each year at our AGM I appeal for a volunteer to come forward to fill the role of Secretary to our National Executive Committee. Halliwick Region Astra 10 is up & running and based in Bath (at present)

We do feel a bit like the 'new kids on the block' at the moment! Astra 10 emerged after the Foundation Course in Bath in Oct 2004. Eight of us from the Bath area decided to keep in touch to find ways of helping each other put what we had learnt on the course into practice. Only one of us had done any Halliwick before & not all of us were actually able to put it into practice straight away! Apart from meeting up to help each other out, exchange ideas & experiences, we decided more courses in the South-West would give us more training on our doorstep as well as getting other people in the area trained & using Halliwick, so it was from this that we decided to form Astra 10, which covers the counties of Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, Somerset and Wiltshire.

So far, we have formed an interim committee but, to be truly democratic, we will be holding an AGM in 2006, so all affiliated members can have their say & hopefully we can get to meet them (more later).

<u>Courses</u> - In April we ran a Foundation course in Cheltenham, & in Oct an Advanced in Llanfrechfa, South Wales - the latter not exactly in our region we know, but it was a case of finding a suitable pool at the right time, as Cheltenham was not available! In April 2006 we are 'coming home' to Cheltenham for a Foundation Course, but, course-wise, that's as far as our plans go at present.

<u>Library</u> - We have also put together a library of most of the Halliwick publications & videos, which are available for anyone from the region to borrow, the only charge being the cost of postage. We hope people will take advantage of the opportunity to see what is available & that it might encourage them to go on & buy their own copies as well.

<u>Study Day</u> - What we would also like to do is reach-out to anybody in the south-west who has done a Halliwick course, but maybe isn't affiliated. Sometimes it can be quite difficult if you've done a training but are working with it in isolation, & it's good to get together with other people to exchange experiences & learn from each other, as well as get some new ideas. With this in mind, we are planning a <u>Halliwick Study Day</u> in the New Year, which we hope will do exactly that. Pamela Woods will be on hand to give us some input, & we'll slip a **short AGM** in there too, but the rest of the time will be according to what the participants want out of it. We look forward to it with great interest.

<u>Future</u> - The nucleus of Astra 10 may be small & inexperienced, but we believe in Halliwick & our aim is to see more Halliwick activity in our region.
