## Menghi Mulchandani 1963 – 2007 one time National Chairperson of Halliwick AST

A Tribute - 13<sup>th</sup> October 2007

As some of you will know, Menghi Mulchandani sadly passed away this last Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> October following a battle with cancer. I have been asked to say a few words in tribute to Menghi and her wonderful contribution to Halliwick.

Menghi was born in India in 1963 and developed polio as a baby. Her parents brought her over from India to the UK firstly for treatment and secondly, for her education. Menghi spent a great deal of time in her early years, in and out of Stanmore Hospital and attended a school for people with "special needs" - and anyone who knew Menghi will know that that phrase is perhaps not a phrase that she would have liked very much!

It was a teacher at the school that thought it would be a good idea if Menghi were able to swim and she contacted Dr. Joan Martin MBE, whom many of you know and who is the President of Halliwick AST. It was then that Menghi's long association with Halliwick began.

Menghi was just 6 years old when she first attended Kensington Emperors Swimming Club in west London. Menghi was not only a swimmer at the club, but took great interest in her fellow members. Ultimately, she became Vice-Chair of Kensington Emperors Swimming Club and only a couple of years ago, organised a fabulous 50<sup>th</sup> birthday party for the club at Kensington Town Hall - no mean achievement. Those of us that attended know what a wonderful event it was, organised, as was typical of Menghi, magnificently. Menghi was a born organiser and enabler of other people.

Her work with Halliwick did not stop there though. She was also, for a number of years, Chair of Halliwick AST and indeed, Chair of the International Halliwick Association. Menghi was involved in Halliwick therefore, not only at her local club level, but regionally, nationally and internationally.

Menghi was also a great advocate for people with disabilities, not only through her work in Halliwick, but otherwise as, for example, an original member and then Chief Executive of "Action Disability Kensington & Chelsea" (ADKC), a centre which many of us know.

Menghi held her own birthday party just last month, to which, many "old" friends of Kensington Emperors Swimming Club were invited. It was a great reunion once again, superbly organised by Menghi, I am told, in just one week!

I hope that this has given you a brief insight into the person that was Menghi Mulchandani. She was a person who had a great love of Halliwick and made an invaluable contribution to Halliwick and, whether they knew it or not, to the people in Halliwick, over many, many years. Her contribution and dedication to Halliwick will not be forgotten and her intelligence, charm and determination to succeed, not only for herself, but for others also will be greatly and sadly missed.

### **News from Hull Optimists**

Lynne Dawes our Membership and Fund Raising Secretary has been extremely successful this year in securing some local community grants and funding for training. We discovered we could be eligible for these grants last year, after some of our committee attended a meeting of the Humberside Learning Consortium. Through this we had an Audit carried out by the Workforce Development. We awaited the ensuing report with some trepidation. Briefly the results were that our swimming teaching skill were great but our organisational skills were somewhat lacking. Not surprising as we all wanted to teach swimming but had very little experience in running organisations. The report gave us a lot of information about grants and courses available to help us become more efficient and we are slowly working our way through some of the recommendations.

We are focusing on committee and organisation skills to become more efficient at organising and publicising our work teaching swimming to the community in Hull and the East Riding. If you have any experience of audits and how to make you club more efficient, we would love to hear from you. (For contact - see below)

## Fund Raising and the FSB

Do you need to raise funds for large expenses such as pool hire? If raffles and jumble sale are not enough, you may apply to funding bodies. They have so many applicants, for limited funds, you need to convince them that money given to your club will be properly used. Registrating with The Fundraising Standards Board (FSB) may help. If you can succeed in fulfilling the conditions of membership it will make be easier to apply for funding as you can use the FSB kite mark when applying. This will assure the funders that you are following best practice in what you do.

#### Denmark 2007

The country of Denmark, and city of Aarhus in particular, were invaded over the weekend of 6<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup> September. Over 50 participant swimmers plus carers and supporters from Norway, Switzerland, *United Kingdom*, Poland and Japan met with almost as many swimmers from areas of Denmark, to be part of the Aarhus Festival Week, the 3<sup>rd</sup> International Halliwick Swimming Gala and to celebrate the 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of HASA (Halliwick in Denmark). The purpose of the swimming gala was to bring together disabled swimmers from other countries in an exciting and free-for-all competition on equal terms.

A guided tour or Aarhus, free time in the city and a practice swim in the baths, set the weekend off to a good start. During the evening everybody got to know each other over a shared meal prepared in the marquee tent in the grounds of the swimming baths.

The Alderman for Sport and Culture, Mr F Knudsen, performed the opening ceremony, after which there was a demonstration of competition swimming with famous athletes from Aarhus. After this, the fun and excitement began. Friendly rivalry was seen as the participants raced in heat after heat over 25, 50 & 100 ms. This was followed by semi-finals, finals and lastly repargee races. Adjudicators and timekeepers were kept busy to ensure correct entry of times.

After all the races were over the participants and supporters joined the Danish team and some former members of HASA in a celebration dinner beautifully provided through the Danish hospitality. Excitement began to rise even higher as results were announced and the medal ceremony began. The cup for the overall winning country was well deserved by Denmark. The UK were placed a well-deserved third. Every participant did their best and carried this same spirit into the dancing and jollity that followed late into the evening.

The IHA (International Halliwick Association) held a meeting of their Executive Committee, followed by their AGM meeting on Sunday the 9<sup>th</sup> September. A new committee was elected, new lecturers approved and reports received from countries affiliated to Halliwick and from the IHA Education and Research Committee.

The weekend was a huge success and everyone came away very tired but happy.
