

My Halliwick Story—William Wyatt



So, what is there to say about me, how I became involved in Halliwick and what I do?

Well, I first became involved in Halliwick in around 1982 when my foster parents brought my brother and me to Halliwick Penguins Swimming Club in Enfield and we joined as swimmers. I have not been able to escape since! If I remember rightly, my first "job" in the club was as a Swimmers' Representative and then a few years later, as Minutes Secretary (why did I ever learn typing and shorthand?!). A few years later, our then club Chair, Paul O'Byrne, suggested that I might like to become Chair of the club. honest, at the time. I was rather hesitant as I thought everyone else on the committee had far more experience than I did, but luckily for me, they were all very kind to me (and still are!).

I have been Chair of the club ever since and I love every minute of it (mostly!). We have a great executive committee who all do a fantastic amount of work to keep the club going behind the scenes and at the weekly swimming sessions, and it is great to see swimmers come along each week and progress both in the water and as individuals. That, for me, is what Halliwick is all about. It teaches a swimmer how to be safe in the water and develops that, of course it does, but it does so much more as well—developing them as individuals, growing in confidence and identity.

As well as being Chair of my club, I have been involved in Halliwick in various other ways, regionally, nationally and internationally. I am your new Chair of Halliwick AST (the UK national association for Halliwick) and I am Secretary of Halliwick ASTRA One (our region, which covers Halliwick clubs in London north of the river Thames). From 2000 to 2011, I was also Secretary of the International Halliwick Association (IHA) which took me to many countries, helping to organise swimming competitions and conferences on Halliwick.

It is amazing to think that Halliwick, started over 60 years ago by James and Phyl McMillan in Enfield, now has users and practitioners, not only throughout the UK but, throughout the world. Whilst Halliwick in the UK is just a part of that, we should remember that this is where it all began and we are an important part of its history—we can and should be very proud of that!

It is my privilege to be a small part of Halliwick—a Concept that has changed for the better and enriched the lives of thousands of people. Oh! And the picture? Well, I love cake too! It comes a close second to Halliwick!

In Loving Memory of Michael (Mike) Brimfield

It is with great sadness that we learned that Mike Brimfield passed away on 18th March 2014, aged 63 years. Here is a tribute to him written by Keith Beer, the Chair of Halliwick ASTRA 15.

We will all miss you very much, Mike—RIP.

Although it was expected it was still with shock and great sadness that the members of the Halliwick Association of Swimming Therapy learnt of the death of Michael Brimfield.

Although he was a larger than life character, in some ways Mike was a contradiction, because he was also a very private person. Mike was not only the rock on which his own club, the Rhondda Polar-Bears, which is one of the largest and most successful clubs in the country, rested, but his work as Regional Vice-Chairman went far beyond that, he helped and guided the newer clubs and their committee members. Over the years I constantly tried to get Mike to take over as Regional Chairman, and he was also invited to stand as National Chairman, but he said he could do far more from the floor than he would be able to do if he



was under the constraints of being a "Neutral" chairman. At Committee Meetings, Mike and I sat at opposite ends of the table and I would watch as after I had outlined the basics of an item on the agenda, all eyes would move from me down the table to find out what Mike thought about it, fortunately we usually agreed on most things and so he was able to put forward the arguments I couldn't.

As well as taking an active part in the organising of galas in the Region and Nationally, Mike was also a hard working member of the National Competitions Committee that co-ordinated and compiled the definitive guide to the running of Halliwick galas.

As I mentioned previously, Mike was also known and respected at a National level and I have received numerous messages of condolence from members of the National Executive Committee, including: the President Dr. Joan Martin, the Chairman Patrick Hastings, the Acting Secretary Eric Dilley and members of the Education & Research Committee Anne Gresswell and Beryl Kelsey, as well as the former Secretary to the International Halliwick Association William Wyatt.

Mike will be greatly missed by many in the Region, since he was a born leader and quietly helped many over difficult times in their lives. As Chairman of the Region I will miss his help and support both as member of the Regional Committee and National Committee, but perhaps mostly as a good friend.
