My Halliwick Story ... by Sarah Cox

I was training as a physiotherapist at the Middlesex Hospital and University College London Medical School in the early 1990's and was used as a 'model' to demonstrate upthrust (in a mushroom float) by my university lecturer, Alison Skinner, who is also a Senior Halliwick Lecturer. Little did I know that was actually my first introduction to Halliwick!

Learning by doing, as much or as little as we were able, and gently being guided onto more challenging water activities all the time, whilst having fun and feeling the effects of the water, was a fantastic part of training as a physiotherapist; it confirmed my professional direction of using water throughout my career.

I also met Beryl Kelsey (another Senior Halliwick Lecturer and now appointed as Emeritus Lecturer by the International Halliwick Association (the IHA)) whilst attending my Halliwick AST Foundation Course in Hull in the mid-2000's, and have been using Halliwick techniques and principles in a more formal way ever since.

I have been an active member of the Aquatic Therapy Association of Chartered Physiotherapists (the ATACP), and have linked with Swim England and their drive to connect with water wellbeing. When sitting on the National Co-ordinating Committee for Disability Swimming (to which Halliwick AST belongs) I met Ann Gresswell (another Senior Halliwick Lecturer and now appointed as Emeritus Lecturer by the IHA) and her drive and passion for Halliwick was evident.

As a confessed optimist, I believe there is a place for different specialist services, clubs, and inspiring individuals in the water, for wellbeing and health space. Ann Thomson MBE (another Senior Halliwick Lecturer) was the person who inspired me to complete a Halliwick AST Advanced Course and then to train as a Halliwick Lecturer.

It has been a journey which, with its challenges, has allowed me to dive deeper (pun intended) into the world of tutoring and lecturing across the UK. I teach undergraduate physiotherapists about aquatic physiotherapy, I have been involved in the ATACP Foundation Course training and training up new lecturers, and, in 2022, I graduated from the University of Cambridge with a PGCert in Clinical Research,



Education and Leadership. One of my current proudest achievements is the new e-learn module on the NHSE Learning Hub, which is about aquatic activity and swimming for health. This is now available on general access.

My Halliwick journey continues and I am now ready to take on the challenge of chairing the Education Committee of Halliwick AST so that it continues its work on sharing the principles of the Halliwick Concept, in the UK and further afield. With the guidance of Ann Gresswell and other lecturers, I hope to work on the Foundation Course and its application process. I have a list of 'to-dos' (I love a list) which includes understanding and evaluating the needs and demands of our members regarding training and education. Making sure that Halliwick AST produces training that is relevant and fit for purpose is vital. That the Halliwick Concept stays prominent and in the public consciousness regarding disability swimming, and that it is the 'gold standard' of education for taking anyone in the water is also vital. I especially want to increase links and cross-working with other organisations and charities, so that we can all share experiences and learn from each other.

I have loved the water since my dad took me into the sea aged ten days' old (I was born in Bahrain), and I have adored the way water changes attitudes, engagement and socialising since finding the Halliwick Concept.

National Championships 2023 ...

What a fun afternoon we had at the 2023 National Championships, hosted by Halliwick ASTRA 1 in Enfield, North London on 28/10/2023.

Four Halliwick ASTRAs (regions) took part: Halliwick ASTRA 1 (Greater London—North of the River Thames); Halliwick ASTRA 2 (Greater London—South of the River Thames, Kent Surrey and Sussex); Halliwick ASTRA 8 (Cheshire, Staffordshire and Shropshire); and Halliwick ASTRA 15 (Wales).
